1 VISITOR CENTER/

2 GRISTMILL

Watch as grain is ground into flour and learn about the highly skilled work of operating and maintaining the gristmill.

Kofi's Fire

A SPARK OF RESISTANCE

Kofi, who was enslaved by the Philipse family, was accused of being one of the "ringleaders" of the so-called "New York Conspiracy" in 1741, when many enslaved Africans and white colonists were charged with plotting to burn Manhattan. Drawing from court documents and records, this new experience shares the story of the revolt, Kofi, his community, and their collective struggle for freedom.
